

Seven Sites in North Alabama Receive "Alabama AdvantageSite" Designation



The AdvantageSite program confirms that documentation critical to the site selection process is ready for prospective industry.



Cooperative District of Winston County Industrial Park.

Located in north central Alabama, this 818 acre industrial park is located within six miles of the new I-22 corridor that runs from Birmingham to Memphis.

Conners Island Business Park



Located in north-east Alabama this industrial park has 426 available acres. The park is located on the beautiful 69,000 acre Lake Guntersville and is within a "Hubzone".



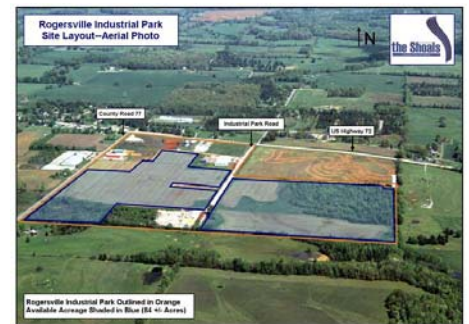
Jackson County Industrial Park

Located in northeast Alabama, this park was the first site in the state to receive "AdvantageSite" designation. This industrial park has 311 acres adjacent to 4-lane US 72. The largest tract is 91 acres.



Cullman Industrial Park IV

Located in the north central portion of Alabama, this 139 acre industrial park is within 3.4 miles of I-65 and within 2.5 miles of four 4-lane highways.



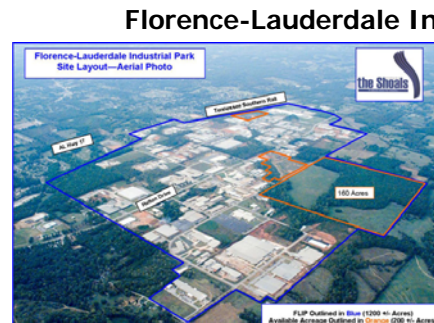
Rogersville Industrial Park

Located in northwest Alabama, this industrial park has 119 acres with 84 acres available. The largest tract is 44 acres. This site is adjacent to 4-lane US 72.



MG Industrial Park

Located in northwest Alabama, this park has 190 acres and is within 2.5 miles of two 4-lane highways and strategically located to the new I-22 corridor.



Florence-Lauderdale Industrial Park

Located in northwest Alabama, this industrial park has 1,200 acres with 200 acres available. The largest tract is 160 acres and is within 3.2 miles of two 4-lane highways.

The AdvantageSite program is sponsored by the Alabama Development Office, the North Alabama Industrial Development Association, Alagasco, Alabama Power Company, PowerSouth and the Economic Development Partnership of Alabama. Simply stated, the Advantage Site Program is an information documentation process that allows communities to show that important information is readily available to prospects. Companies seeking to locate a new facility are allowing less time for site selection and project construction, and they're demanding more information. To meet the needs of industry, our economic development community is working to designate an inventory of industrial sites with the necessary documentation for accurate, timely project evaluation. **So far there are thirteen such sites in the State of Alabama and seven of those are in the NAIDA territory.**
